I am honoured and sincerely grateful to the ISKSAA organizing committee and the fellowship selection board for awarding me the **Bradford UK Travelling Fellowship in Knee Arthroscopy, Sports Injury, and Arthroplasty**. Under the esteemed mentorship of **Mr. Stephen Guy**, I had the privilege of undertaking this fellowship from **June 30th to July 13th, 2025**. This opportunity represents a significant milestone in my professional journey, and I deeply appreciate the trust and support extended to me.

The fellowship was based at the **Bradford Royal Infirmary**, a distinguished institution in **West Yorkshire**, known for its excellence in orthopaedic care, innovation, and teaching.
