## **ISKSAA Netherlands Travelling Fellowship 2016**

It was a year back when I was among the lucky ones who were chosen by ISKSAA and that's how a great opportunity to be a part of ISKSAA NETHERLANDS TRAVELLING FELLOWSHIP came into my hands.

When the excitement began to settle down, honestly speaking, for a moment I even wondered how much can a person learn in three weeks in a totally new setup, new country and among new people.

But as time came close, through e-mail exchanges with Dr. Pushpinder Bajaj, Dr. LalitMainiand Dr. Jaap Willems, the schedule and programs were intimated to me and my co-fellow, now a very dear friend of mine, Dr. Madan Temker. On 19<sup>th</sup> evening Dr. Jaap Willems picked us up for dinner and explained the programs details along with a lively insight into the intricacies of healthcare system in Netherlands. He gave us a tour of the city, its important landmarks and was kind enough to give us each, a travel card for easy and convenient use of public transport in Amsterdam.

Our academic journey thus began on 20<sup>th</sup> June with Dr. Jaap Willems at DC clinic, where we got the opportunity to attend his OPD, examine patients and discuss the knowledge nuggets, pearls, tips and tricks to diagnose and treat a wide variety of



shoulder cases, on both, 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> June. We were also introduced to the liberal use of ultrasonography to diagnose various shoulder pathologies, even before ordering an expensive MRI scan, something that I was able to incorporate in my practice soon after coming back. sir also shared various articles with us, as we discussed cases in OPD and planned the next OT list.

On 22<sup>nd</sup> June we had our first OR exposure at DC clinic and we were fortunate enough toassist, get supervised handson exposure on various cases like calcifictendinitis, Recurrent rotator cuff repair, hook plate for AC joint dislocation, Ossificcoraco-clavicular

interference screw and arthroscopic lateral clavicular resection.

Then came the weekend and the "Dutch" for sure know how to make the best use of theirs. Dr. Jaap played a more than perfect host to us as he took us around the famous canals in his boat and treated us



to amazing food and local hospitality.



On 26<sup>th</sup> June, We met Dr. Derek van Deurzen, at OLVG hospital, who extended an extremely warm welcome and treated us to a surgically stimulating day where we assisted cases like

subpectoraltenodesis of biceps, total shoulder arthroplasty, rotator cuff tear etc.



Next 2 days were again spent with Dr. Jaap Willems in OPD in a highly charged academic atmosphere, discussing and examining patients. Jaap sir also introduced us to the use of 3D printing in designing patient specific jig for shoulder arthroplasty at one's own PC. The concept was further explained by none other than Dr.

Walch himself when we got the opportunity to meet him at a meeting at AlmereKamers where he explained, in detail, his technique of shoulder arthroplasty, shared tips n tricks for few difficult cases with the use of 3D printing.On 29<sup>th</sup> June, we again got the opportunity to assist Dr. Willems in surgeries ranging from superior capsular reconstruction for irreparable rotator cuff tear, osacromiale to biceps ganglion cyst.

We again went to Dr. Tjarco Alta at SpaarneGasthuisHoofddorp on 30<sup>th</sup> June and assisted in surgeries like Total shoulder arthroplasty, bankart repair, slap repair and periarthritis shoulder.

1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> July, the second weekend, we had time to ourselves to explore the city. Dr. Madan Temker was a real great company and I learnt many things from him, both in professional and



personal fronts. We finally packed up and left for Utrecht when Dr. Jaap Willems personally drove us there for advanced cadaver course on 2<sup>nd</sup>July evening. This prestigious course, a huge thanks to ISKSAA, Dr. Pushpinder Bajaj and Dr, Jaap Willems, was fully sponsored including the stay, amounting to €3000.

The whole duration of Utrecht cadaveric course, over the next week, took the idea and concept

of arthroscopy and arthroplasty, in upper limb, to a whole new level. The limited number of people on each cadaveric limb made the workshop highly fulfilling. The instructors were there to help us with any difficulty we faced. Dr. Willems, there too personally ensured that we got the best places to practice and guided us



in performing some of the advanced arthroscopy and arthroplasty procedures. We performed surgeries like wrist arthroplasty, PIP and DIP arthroplasty, elbow and shoulder arthroscopy and shoulder arthroplasty.

At the end of cadaveric course, Dr. Jaap Willems drove us back to airport and we can never be thankful enough for all his kindness, thoughtfulness, his teachings and the confidence he instilled in us.

While on my way back to India, I just couldn't help smile to myself at the initial silly thought that I had regarding how much can a person actually learn in three weeks. I realized, a lot can be achieved in that time span if you have the correct guidance and a stimulating environment. There I was, the same person but much wiser, much knowledgeable, more confidant and even much more happy and humbled.
